INFORMATION FOR MEETING WITH LEGISLATORS

- Please try to come prepared with a few notes and be on time to meetings.
- Group Leaders will help to facilitate the meetings and have hand outs from CPA.
- ♦ We encourage students to share their **personal stories** of how gifted education has affected them personally. If students have letters or other mementos they wish to give to legislators with whom we meet, they are welcome to do so.
- **❖** Key Talking Points:
 - Introduce your self (name and where you are from)
 - Thank them for including Highly Capable Programs in basic education. As HB 2261 says so clearly, "access to accelerated learning and enhanced instruction is access to a basic education" for Highly Capable students. This is very important with the WA Supreme Court ruling this month that upholds that basic education must be funded. Thank them for maintaining funding in the current budget.
 - Explain how being in a Highly Capable Program has improved student's educational experiences and how it might help them in the future.
